Lead in School Results

General Manager Frasier reviewed the Lead in School Results with The Board. The results were excellent.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT:

Power Failures

The District experienced a power failure at Jackson Station on April 20 due to an issue at Central Maine Power's pole. Significant damage caused the station to be down until repairs could be made on Friday, April 28.

On April 22, the Taylor well motor failed. Frank Hegarty Plumbing of Buxton performed diagnostic tests on the motor and determined there was no apparent cause. Mr. Hegarty will be setting up a temporary pump but has been delayed due to the weather, and consequently delaying the pilot plant work.

Public Relations Assistance

General Manager Frasier and Assistant General Manager Douglas met with Meredith Strang Burgess of Burgess Advertising to discuss the Jackson Station replacement project. Ms. Burgess is putting together a communications plan and proposal for the District's consideration.

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS:

On-line THM Analyzer Update

The Online THM Analyzer that the District is renting has proven to be an invaluable piece of equipment for the District. Daily automatic samples are done and the results are very accurate. There is an action item to purchase the analyzer.

Thomas Point Road Main Extension

The District has received inquiries about extending the main 3,000 feet on Thomas Point Road for a residential development. After some discussion it was noted the Board voted in 1987 not to invest in main extensions.

Jordan Avenue Well Field

The District has had unsuccessful attempts of rehabilitating the Jordan Ave Well Field. There are currently 138 wells connected to a vacuum system that are producing half of what they should be. Replacing the current wells would be costly and labor intensive. The District is looking into gravel packed wells as an alternative.

Design and Construction Services for New Facility

The request for Statements of Qualifications for engineering services for the Jackson project have been sent out and are due back by June 1.

ACTION ITEMS:

17-05 On-Line THM Analyzer

The Board is requested to take any action it deems appropriate to add \$30,000 to the capital budget for purchase of the on-line THM analyzer.

A motion was made by Vice President Kay and seconded by Trustee Lawler to add \$30,000 to the capital budget for purchase of the on-line THM analyzer. There was a unanimous vote in favor of the motion.

17-06 Property Damage Incident

The Board is requested to take any action it deems necessary.

A motion was made by Vice President Kay and seconded by Trustee Moll to obtain a release from Mr. Peter Murray and pay his claim of \$4097.17 to have Servpro clean his basement due to water damage. There was a unanimous vote in favor of the motion.
